



Brock Clay Hosts Inaugural “Women of the Bar” Event

Continuing the firm’s long tradition of supporting community initiatives, Brock Clay attorney and Cobb Bar Association President-Elect, Nancy Ingram Jordan, welcomed the first meeting of the Women of the Bar Committee on October 1, at the law offices of Brock Clay Calhoun & Rogers, LLC.

Carol Callaway and Suzann Wilcox from Brock Clay were not able to attend but will be active with the group.

Named only as a special committee, the Women of the Bar Committee will not seek to become a formal section of the Cobb Bar Association. Instead, the committee will serve as an informal group of attorneys working for the mutual benefit of all the bar's members.
