

Clay Honored by Georgia National Guard

New Building to be Named for General Lucius D. Clay, Grandfather of Marietta Attorney and Founding Partner of Brock Clay

At the recent groundbreaking of the new Georgia National Guard Headquarters **Charles Commander “Chuck” Clay** was honored to join as the Guard recognized his grandfather by naming the building The General Lucius D. Clay Headquarters.

The GNG is now located at the former Naval Air Station Atlanta, which has been closed by the 2007 Base Realignment and Closure process through the US Department of Defense. Cobb County was disappointed to lose NAS, but fortunate the state of Georgia agreed to move the Georgia National Guard to the old site. To meet the needs of the National Guard they will be constructing a new 200,000 square foot building to go with the existing structures.

Over 300 Georgia National Guard and local community leaders attended the ceremony for the official closing of NAS and the groundbreaking of the new building.



Maj. General Terry Nesbitt, Adjutant General of Georgia, along with other dignitaries, joined Clay, his wife Sara and their children with shovels for the official groundbreaking.
