

Nancy Ingram Jordan Sworn in as 2010-2011 President of the Cobb County Bar Association

Jordan Becomes only the 9th Female in History to Head the Second Largest Local Bar Organization in Georgia



Marietta, GA - Attorneys and Judges making up the Cobb County Bar Association gathered at the Mansour Center to hold their monthly business meeting and the swearing in of Nancy Ingram Jordan as President of the Cobb Bar, as well as the recognition of the other officers and committee chairmen who will work with Jordan for the upcoming year. However, this year's transfer of leadership was a unique family affair with historical significance.

Ms. Jordan was given the oath as the 2010-2011 President by her sister, Judge Lark Ingram on Thursday at noon before the Association's membership, with her father Senior Judge Conley Ingram, who served as the President in 1958-59, by their sides. The Ingram-Jordan team is the first time a father and daughter have held this position with the Cobb County Bar Association. Jordan also became only the 9th woman President of the Association.



In her comments Ms Jordan said, “I am looking forward to the excitement and challenges of the year ahead.” She continued, “We hope to provide many opportunities for the membership through informative meetings and programs, as well as hopefully making a difference through our numerous community service projects.”
