Special Education Attorneys Win at the 11th Circuit

The 11th Circuit Court of Appeals recently ruled in favor of the Cobb County School District and Brock, Clay, Calhoun & Rogers, P.C. in the matter of Robert K. ex rel. T.K. v. Cobb County Sch. Dist. <http://www.calluscourts.gov/unpub/ops/200714137.pdf>, No. 07-14137 (11th Cir. May 28, 2008). The court found that T.K. and his parents did not qualify as a “prevailing party” for purposes of attorneys’ fees because their claims were not brought under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This favorable ruling saved the District many thousands of dollars in fees and costs.
